- Faith community as a contributor to regional capacity



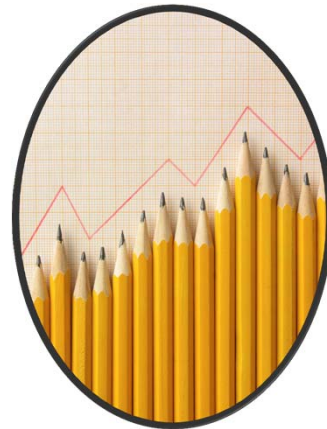
